Followers of the Worldbuilders believe that there are many Worlds out there, each following their own set of rules. This World was built and continues to be overseen by the great god Crookshanks, he who writes the Book of Truth. Other Worlds are overseen by the Wainwright, the Firecat, the Pentumvirate, and many others not yet discovered - these are known solely through the dreams and prayers of Crookshank's followers in this World, and it is considered a task of any of the followers of the Worldbuilders to find out about and understand the other members of the pantheon.

Their other main task is to understand the underlying rules of the World and the changes made to the Book of Truth, which can only be learnt of through talking to the great god Crookshanks during prayer (as any changes to the Book are automatically a part of the World and have always been so).

Priests and followers of the Worldbuilders in this World tend to be aligned to Justice, as this is clearly what Crookshanks wants them to be. There are instances of them 'going to the bad', however; this is either due to being seduced by the concepts of one of the darker members of the Pantheon, or else either agreeing or disagreeing so strongly with one of the changes to the Book of Truth as to attempt to overly enforce or directly oppose it to the detriment of the World.

The ultimate question for any follower of the Worldbuilders is not, "What's the point of it all?" as this is something they instinctively know ("To enjoy life and be a big damned hero."). It is, instead, "What in the World does 'nerf' mean?"
